Tasks

- Conception, implementation and evaluation of experimental studies in the field of applied cognitive psychology (such as risk perception, human-machine interaction),
- Conducting of own research projects.
- Teaching in the amount of 2 hours per week in the fields of knowledge, communication and media psychology is mandatory.
