- Free data collection in our offline lab equipped with a variety of eye tracking devices or via an online panel (PsychLab offline/online)
- A web-based application to support collaborative, low-threshold, and easy-to-archive study planning and data analysis functionalities (PsychNotebook)

Our lab is further equipped with a variety of eye tracking devices (EyeLink 1000+, Tobii Spectrum, Tobii Pro X3-120, mobile eye tracker by Pupil Labs) providing the opportunity to develop and pursue own research interests utilizing this infrastructure.
