The Max Planck Institute for Research on Collective Goods offers the following position:

Post-doc in Psychology or Behavioral Economics

The position is part of the Gielen-Leyendecker Research Group "Cognitive Processes Underlying Economic Decision Making" headed by Susann Fiedler. The work program investigates the interplay of individual and situational factors affecting decision behavior and focuses on two major challenges: (1) Understanding the underlying cognitive and affective processes leading up to a choice and (2) identifying the channels through which situational as well as personality factors operate.

The successful candidate is expected to have an excellent background in psychology or behavioral economics, very good skills in data analysis, first experience or a strong motivation to pursue process tracing research (i.e., eye-tracking) and to contribute to the interdisciplinary agenda of the Max Planck Institute (with its research groups in economics, law and psychology), to present her/his work at conferences and to participate in the activities of the institute (seminars, workshops, etc.).

The Post-doc position is limited to two years. Applicants should have or be very near completion of a Ph.D. in Psychology or an equivalent qualification (such as economics or management). There is no teaching obligation involved in this position. Salary is paid in accordance with the rules for federal employees in Germany. We offer civil service employment benefits.
