## Research Assistant / PhD position (65% TVL) for 3 years starting as soon as possible

The successful candidate will work in a project funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) which is part of the priority program SPP 2134 "The active self". The project studies how transformations between body movements and sensory feedback affect various forms of agency and body-ownership.

The position requires the planning and preparation of behavioral experiments, data analyses, publishing results in international journals, and presenting at national and international conferences. Applicants should hold a Master or Diploma degree in Psychology, Cognitive Science, Neuroscience, or related areas. The project requires a close interdisciplinary collaboration with developmental psychologists and computer scientists. Applicants should ideally have experience in programming PC-based experiments (e.g. in Eprime or C#), EEG data collection and analyses, and analyses of body motion data.
